ON TO EAST LANSING!

THE ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF EDUCATIONAL BROADCASTERS WILL BE MEETING ON THE CAMPUS OF MICHIGAN STATE COLLEGE, EAST LANSING, MICHIGAN, ON MONDAY AND TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 AND OCTOBER 1.

HOTEL HEADQUARTERS WILL BE HOTEL OLDS, LANSING. A RESERVATION CARD IS ENCLOSED WITH THIS LETTER, SO MAKE YOUR RESERVATIONS EARLY.

THE MONDAY EVENING MEAL AND MEETING WILL BE HELD AT HOTEL OLDS. ALL OTHER MEETINGS AND EATINGS WILL BE ON THE CAMPUS, OR JUST OFF THE CAMPUS. LOCAL ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING MADE BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE LOCAL ARRANGEMENTS COMMITTEE, DIRECTOR R. J. COLEMAN. ON-CAMPUS MEETINGS WILL BE HELD IN THE SUN PARLOR OF THE MICHIGAN STATE UNION BUILDING.

YOU REACH EAST LANSING BY RAIL OR BUS BEST VIA CHICAGO OR DETROIT. YOU REACH EAST LANSING BY CAR, PICKING YOUR OWN ROUTE. FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE WE'LL ENCLOSE SOME ROAD MAPS WITH THIS ISSUE.

THE PROGRAM WILL BE STRICTLY INFORMAL, BUT BUSINESSLIKE AND ON BUSINESS OF NAEB. THERE'LL BE NO FORMAL PROGRAM PLANNED, EXCEPT AT THE OPENING THE USUAL FORMALITIES OF WELCOME AND KICK-OFF. AND, I WARN YOU IF THE OUTGOING PRESIDENT HAS TIME TO PREPARE A SPEECH YOU'LL LIKELY BE BORED WITH ONE. I INSIST.

TOPICS WHICH WILL BE LISTED ON THE CONVENTION AGENDA INCLUDE:

ESTABLISHING A SERVICE IN WASHINGTON FOR EDUCATIONAL STATIONS.

INCREASING MEMBERSHIP OF NAEB.

ORIGINIZING NAEB INTO REGIONS BY DISCUSSION OF A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT AND PROVIDING FOR MAIL VOTE ON THE PROPOSAL.

ESTABLISHMENT OF A NAEB PROGRAM SERVICE AND THE NAEB LEGAL SERVICE.

THE DEVELOPMENT OF FM BY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS.

THE GRANTING OF FACILITIES IN THE NONCOMMERCIAL FM BANDS BY THE FCC TO RELIGIOUS INSTITUTIONS WHICH, STRICTLY SPEAKING, ARE NOT EDUCATIONAL.

THE PUBLICATION OF AN NAEB BROCHURE.

THE FCC RULING ON IDENTIFICATION OF RECORDS AND TRANSCRIPTIONS.

OTHER ITEMS WHICH MAY BE BROUGHT UP BY MEMBERS.

ANNUAL REPORTS OF PRESIDENT, EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, AND TREASURER.

SELECTION OF NEXT CONVENTION SITE AND DATES.

THE OPENING SESSION WILL BE HELD AT 9:30 A.M. LOCAL TIME (WHICH WILL BE STANDARD TIME FOR MICHIGAN) ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 30.

NAEB LUNCHEON AT SBC

THE NAEB EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE HAS VOTED TO HOLD A LUNCHEON IN CONNECTION WITH THE SCHOOL BROADCAST CONFERENCE AT THE CONTINENTAL HOTEL, CHICAGO, ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 21. DETAILS WILL BE ANNOUNCED LATER.

THE SCHOOL BROADCAST CONFERENCE, THE TENTH ANNUAL, WILL BE HELD OCTOBER 21, 22, AND 23. GEORGE JENNINGS, DIRECTOR OF THE CONFERENCE, PREDICTS ATTENDANCE WILL TOP ALL PREVIOUS RECORDS. LAST YEAR, MORE THAN 300 DELEGATES FROM ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTRY ATTENDED. THE CONFERENCE WILL TREAT WITH THE VARIOUS USES OF RADIO IN EDUCATION. ONE SESSION WILL BE DEVOTED EXCLUSIVELY TO PROBLEMS OF THE VETERAN AND RADIO. A NEW EQUIPMENT EXHIBIT, INCLUDING TELEVISION, FACSIMILE, AND RECORDIO, WILL BE ONE OF THE FEATURES, TOO. HOTEL RESERVATIONS SHOULD BE MADE EARLY.

GEORGE ALSO WANTS ME TO SAY THAT MEMBERS OF NAEB ARE INVITED TO SEND STATION AND PROGRAM PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL TO THE SBC FOR DISTRIBUTION. MATERIAL SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO GEORGE JENNINGS, SCHOOL BROADCAST CONFERENCE, HOTEL CONTINENTAL, CHICAGO. IT SHOULD ARRIVE NO LATER THAN SATURDAY, OCTOBER 19.

FCC ACTIONS

OR, MORE SPECIFICALLY, SOME ACTIONS OF THE COMMISSIONS ARE SOME CASES BEFORE THE FCC:

WILL, UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS, HAD ITS LICENSE RENEWED TO MAY 1, 1949, BY ACTION OF THE FCC ON JULY 26.

KUSC, UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, WAS GRANTED MODIFICATION OF ITS CONSTRUCTION PERMIT FOR A NEW NONCOMMERCIAL, EDUCATIONAL BROADCAST STATION. ACTION WAS TAKEN ON AUGUST 1.

WBOE, CLEVELAND CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION, WAS GRANTED CONSTRUCTION PERMIT TO SPECIFY FREQUENCY AS 90.1 MC (CHANNEL 211), AND TO MAKE OTHER CHANGES. ACTION ALSO TAKEN ON THE FIRST DAY OF LAST MONTH.

RELEASE OF THE FCC, DATED AUGUST 8, ANNOUNCED RENEWAL OF LICENSES FOR WBEZ, CHICAGO,; WBOE, CLEVELAND; WIUC, URBANA, AND WNYE, BROOKLYN.

THE COMMISSION ACCEPTED FOR FILING, ON AUGUST 16, THE APPLICATION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF NEWARK FOR EXTENSION OF COMPLETION DATE ON ITS CP.

ST. LOUIS UNIVERSITY'S APPLICATION FOR A CP FOR A NEW EXPERIMENTAL TELEVISION STATION WAS ACCEPTED FOR FILING ON AUGUST 15.

THE FCC ACCEPTED FOR FILING THE APPLICATION OF THE BIBLE INSTITUTE OF LOS ANGELES, INC., FOR A CP FOR A NEW NONCOMMERCIAL EDUCATIONAL BROADCAST STATION. ACCEPTED ON AUGUST 15. (EDITORS NOTE: IS IT AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION? BE PRESENT AT THE NAEB CONVENTION.)

THE COMMISSION ALSO ACCEPTED FOR FILING THE APPLICATION OF WNYC, MUNICIPAL BROADCASTING SYSTEM, NEW YORK, FOR EXTENSION OF THE SPECIAL SERVICE AUTHORIZATION TO OPERATE ADDITIONAL HOURS BETWEEN 6 A.M. AND 10 P.M., EST.
